- **Environment Education**

Albert Einstein rightly said, "Look deep into nature, and then you will understand everything better ".

Environmental education is an integral part of the school curriculum and aims to create awareness and responsibility towards the environment among students. Environmental concepts are integrated across subjects and

reinforced through project work, discussions, and activity-based learning according to the C.B.S.E. guidelines.

The Eco club of the school under the able guidance of its teachers promotes a love for environment by organising various activities.

- **Hands on gardening experience:**

Students learnt to make seed balls and used them during the rainy season to increase greenery in the surroundings. They also engaged actively in plant identification, ploughing, and learnt essential gardening skills. They explored organic gardening practices by preparing natural insecticides and fungicides using neem and turmeric, promoting eco-friendly and chemical free methods. Bottle planters were presented to teachers on Teachers' Day as a token of appreciation and environmental responsibility.

- **Environmental awareness and sustainability:**

To strengthen environmental awareness, students participated in compost preparation from kitchen waste and projects based on reduce, reuse, and recycle were initiated.

The school organized a Paper Recycling Project to reduce waste and promote environmental awareness among students. The main objectives were to collect and recycle waste paper, teach students about sustainable practices, and reuse recycled paper for school activities. Through this initiative, over 500 kg of paper was recycled, and students gained valuable knowledge about recycling and its importance. The recycled paper was used for art and craft projects, demonstrating practical reuse. The project successfully encouraged eco-friendly habits and showed students the value of recycling in daily life.

- **Campaigns organised:**

Campaigns like 'Say no to polythene 'and 'Say no to crackers' were also organised to promote sensitivity amongst the students. Apart from this the students were taken on nature visit to Nahargarh biological Park to understand the importance of wildlife conservation. A visit to Olitia Olive Farm was organised to help students gain insight into organic and sustainable living.

The Eco club of the school remains committed to the belief that small steps lead to a greener future.

The school took part in the Wipro Earthian Project, which promotes environmental awareness and sustainability. Students from Class 8 explored topics like water conservation, biodiversity, and waste management through research and fieldwork.
