HOW GOD SAVED MY FATHER

As it is written in the Bible:

"God will put his angels in charge of you to protect you wherever you go. They will hold you with their hand to keep you safe from hurting your feet on the stones".

How reliable God's words are? I praise Lord and owe him my father's life who has been miraculously saved after he met with a fatal accident. It was all because of God's mercy.

It was 20th May, 2013 at around 10.00 am when we met with the fearful accident while travelling from Jaipur to Kerala by road. No one knew how it happened. I was reading a book, my mom was taking something from her bag at that moment and my uncle was sleeping. My father was driving. Suddenly there was a jerk and I fell down. I was conscious and so I opened the door and moved out while my mom and uncle were taken out by people living nearby. It took about half-an-hour to drag my father out of the crushed part of the driver's seat.

It's only God who gave me the courage to control my emotions and be mature enough to handle the situation. Then began our ordeals. Many hospitals refused to take my father, as he was in a very critical condition. Another problem was getting an I.C.U Ambulance. But with the co-operation of the people around we reached Unity Hospital in Mangalore at around 7.30 pm. As Fr. Edward was not able to come

there he sent his relative to be with us in that hour of crisis.

The doctors were astonished to see how my father had survived after such a traumatic accident. The doctor explained that my father's skull had been crushed to pieces and the brain was severely damaged. He was kept under observation for two weeks.

Fr. Edward visited us with his mother and relatives and prayed for us. The doctors took courage and conducted an operation on 3rd June, which was successful.

Even doctors acknowledge God's power in the saving of my father's life. It was about the end of June when my father started talking and identifying people.

It was an auspicious moment when we stepped out of the Unity Hospital. We were all overwhelmed with joy. Although, he is still recovering but being alive today with us in not less than a wonder.

My special thanks to Rev. Fr. Edward for giving me a chance to express my feelings.






A teacher influences eternity. She can never tell where her influence ends. After rendering their services for long years, time has come to bid good-bye.



PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE.....

TO BE OR NOT TO BE A TEACHER

On 4th Sept. on the eve of Teachers' Day, we, the teachers of our mission schools from Jaipur region gathered together at St. Xavier's School for a get together. One of the eminent speakers, Mr. P Biswas rightly said, the word 'teacher' usually does not stir anyone's imagination. It looks as if the profession of a teacher is in the least demand, it seems the cleverest, the smartest and the best would choose any other career other than being a teacher. In fact, those counsellors who frequently visit the schools for career guidance never ever speak of 'Teaching' as a worthy career for students.

Is teaching such a worthless job? Is it meant for back benchers, the mediocres and the unintelligent? The question is difficult to answer? Whatever it may be, the importance of a teacher can never be evaluated, otherwise the Prime Minister himself would not have spoken to the students of the entire nation on the Teachers' Day.

MY PERSONAL EXPERIENCE:

I have been a teacher for nearly 32 years of my life. I have taught in the class rooms and I have been guiding teachers as a Principal. During these years, I had the opportunity of interacting with teachers, Principals and students of many other schools.

After so many years of interaction with students and teachers, I feel something missing if I am far away from them. I also meet their parents who always have a kind word spoken. Recently, when I was in the United States it was a joy to meet some of my students teaching in well known Universities.

IDENTITY OF A TEACHER:

It may seem that in the modern world with all the technological advancements a teacher will eventually become redundant. The answer lies in the very profession of teaching. It is like saying that with the advancement in medical sciences doctors will become redundant.

The debate whether present day teachers match the 'gurus' of yesteryears will go on endlessly.

The fact of the matter is, if the modern day teacher is not what the teachers were in the past, the modern day student community is also not what it was in the past. In the changed scenario with nuclear families replacing traditional joint families and the tremendous permutations that have occurred in the society, the role of a teacher is bound to change, but in the ultimate analysis we will never be able to do away with teachers and replace them with something else, like the books being gradually replaced by e-books.

In reality teaching is neither a profession nor a career, it is not something that can be embraced by each and everyone. A coaching centre could be a profession but teaching is first and foremost a vocation. Much more than the remunerations, it is the response, appreciation and acceptance by the students that satisfies a teacher. Hence a teacher will always be a role model, a counsellor, a friend to a student, whose personal touch will be more important than skills of pedagogy.

A good teacher is not one who knows everything but the one who knows how to impart knowledge according to the nature of a particular child; for this a teacher along with the students must keep learning new methods, new ways and become as relevant as possible. A teacher's job is not without criticism, he/she must learn to accept what is positive and leave the rest without feeling offended.

Finally, the place of a teacher is always in the heart. Students never forget the efforts made by teachers, the sweet and sour of student's life linger in the mind all through the life of a student and as they grow into maturity they do understand the important role played by a teacher in their life. It is a relation of a heart and mind that will last for a lifetime.

Even though student may not remember us again and again, memories don't fade so easily, we can see it in their eyes as they meet us along the way somewhere, sometimes. Perhaps that is more than enough to make me continue to be a teacher.
