
The Tales of Triumph

Key aspects included:


Positive reinforcement – Boosting confidence through praise and feedback.




श्रमिक दिवस का पर्व



Constitution Day Celebrated with Patriotic Fervor




ENGLISH LANGUAGE CLUB




हिन्दी भाषा क्लब

Our Experience on the Eco Trip to Olivia Farm

'The best time to plant a tree was 25 years ago, today and forever.'

Our trip began with the iconic 'India's First Olive Tree,' planted in 2007. Olive trees, with a lifespan of up to 8,000 years, showcase resilience. As we explored the farm, we saw vegetables like chillies, broccoli, cauliflower and cabbage planted to boost pollination. We also discovered fruit trees such as mango, chikoo and lemon adding to the farm's biodiversity. The farm's innovative organic practices, including decomposing pits with soil and cow dung, enriched the Earth's fertility. A 22-feet-deep water reservoir collects rainwater to irrigate crops sustainably. The farm runs entirely on solar power, making it environmentally conscious. The Poly Net House, built to combat rising temperatures, ensures ideal conditions for plant growth, as seen with the flourishing tomatoes.

Hand-pollination techniques are used to maximize crop production. The farm also offers products like Olive Tea, Hibiscus Tea, Chamomile Tea, Face Mist and Rose Petal Preserve for those interested in organic goods. To top off our visit, we enjoyed traditional Dal Bati Churma, with the Batti cooked on ash for a smoky flavour. This experience gave us a deeper understanding of sustainable farming, from soil enrichment to water conservation. It was a true celebration of nature and the importance of preserving our planet.


Unconventional Career Paths Exploring Unique Opportunities

"Every assignment completed today is a step towards the future you dream of."



So, the next time you feel buried under homework, remember: it's not an enemy but an opportunity in disguise.




TIME - MANAGEMENT

THE 'RATAN' OF INDIA MR. RATAN N. TATA

A legend of our times, a visionary leader, an epitome of compassion and grace, a generous philanthropist, and much more—he was none other than Padma Vibhushan Mr. Ratan Naval Tata. Ratan Tata lived his life as a living legacy. He was truly an extraordinary leader who shaped not only the Tata Group but also the very fabric of our nation. It would be correct to say that India lost a 'Ratan' on October 9, 2024—an icon who inspired us with his steadfast commitment to excellence, integrity, and innovation. Such was his impact that the world today bows in reverence to him.

Born to Sooni Tata and Naval Tata during British rule in Mumbai (then Bombay) on December 28, 1937, he was a teetotaler, a non-smoker, and a lifelong bachelor who came close to marrying thrice but remained single. He received his education at prestigious institutions, including Campion School, Cathedral and John Connon School in South Mumbai and Bishop Cotton School in Shimla. He went on to earn a Bachelor of Architecture degree from Cornell University. In 1962, he joined Tata Industries as an assistant and after 29 years, rose to become the Chairman of Tata Sons. He was the visionary leader the Tata Group needed, elevating its value from \$300 million in 1991 to a staggering \$11 billion in 2012. Ratan Tata did for the Tata Group what Sardar Patel did for India in 1947—unifying and strengthening its foundation.

Ratan Tata passed away at the age of 86. It marked the loss of a true 'colossus.' Despite his immense achievements, he remained humble throughout his life. His legacy will continue to inspire us as we strive to uphold the principles he so passionately championed. We must all rededicate ourselves to carrying forward his legacy, which is rooted in India's civilizational values and the pursuit of the welfare of all.
